It's a representative adaptation of the original work, yet an original piece in its own right.

And as a genuine oil painted adaptation, these pictures have value. Over the years, the adaptations become collector's pieces in their own right as the artists themselves become more established.

You can impress your friends. Unlike owning a print, which is flat, printed on glossy art paper and not really something a collector would own relish and love, these are oil paintings, beautiful collectable works of art with a sheen, colour, depth and texture, just like the real thing!

The British Art Academy opens at 35 Walcot Street, Bath on 5th December. The first exhibition includes classic fine art adaptations and will showcase the original work of upcoming local artists.
