Experience some swashbuckling fun at Tutbury Castle's Land Pirates Bank Holiday event taking place between the 12 – 13 April. The castle will be filled with buccaneers, strumpets and pick pockets, re-enacting scenes from a fictional battle between a gang of pirates and highwayman.
