Glass door knobs with an un-sprung chrome plated base (<http://www.simplydoorhandles.co.uk/products/index.asp?brand=45>) are supplied in pairs with the necessary matching screws and spindle. At less than £30 James thinks that they are a very affordable piece of luxury for any home.
