Advanced wins the Superstars award

The TLG Awards reward companies whose employees have made an incredible impact on the work of The Prince's Trust by participating in a fundraising challenge, or by volunteering on a Trust programme. These fundraising activities are key to helping young people across the UK to turn their lives around.

Advanced was presented with the Superstars Award in recognition of the achievements of the Advanced staff who recently took part in The Prince's Trust UK Wild Challenge, raising an impressive £18,000. One of the teams – ABSFab – raised a total of £6,235, which is the second highest amount of the 39 participating teams. The physically gruelling Wild UK Challenge saw 17 members of Advanced's staff hike, cycle and kayak over 100 miles from Somerset to Devon in just three days.
