"Those initiatives helped us to an even better result and a place in the top 50 this time, and once again every team in the business will be carefully looking through the results of the survey to see where improvements can be made," he said. "Those reports will be collated and we will then develop new initiatives to make Zen an even better place to work."

The Best Companies awards are the largest survey of workplace engagement in the UK, and measure organisations for leadership, staff well-being, how staff feel about their managers, colleagues and the company generally, and how happy they are with their pay and benefits. Best Companies has been developing its accreditation standards for over 12 years, in the belief that staff satisfaction is a key driver of company success.
